## **Code of Good Practise for: Korfball**

Leeds University Korfball Club is committed to ensuring that fairness and equality is incorporated across all aspects of its development.

Leeds University Korfball Club respects the rights, dignity and worth of every Club member and will treat everyone equally within the context of the sport, regardless of age, ability, gender, race, ethnicity, religious belief, sexuality or social/economic status.

Leeds University Korfball Club is committed to everyone having the right to enjoy their sport in an environment free from threat of intimidation, harassment and abuse.

All Club members have a responsibility to oppose discriminatory behaviour and promote equality of opportunity for the enjoyment of all.

### **ALL MEMBERS**

The essence of good ethical conduct and practice is summarised below. All Club members must:

- act against and minimise the dangers to the wellbeing and safety of players and others in attendance at any match, training session or event;
- develop relationships with other players, officials, coaches and volunteers, based on mutual respect, and never be rude or abusive to club members, spectators, sports hall staff, members of other clubs or referees;
- raise concerns about any activities which may not be appropriate to the age, ability, physical capabilities or experience of yourself or others taking part;
- be positive about korfball, strive to enjoy what you are doing, and promote the positive aspects of the sport (eg fair play and enjoyment);
- maintain a standard of behaviour at all club functions, matches and training which is appropriate to represent the club;
