

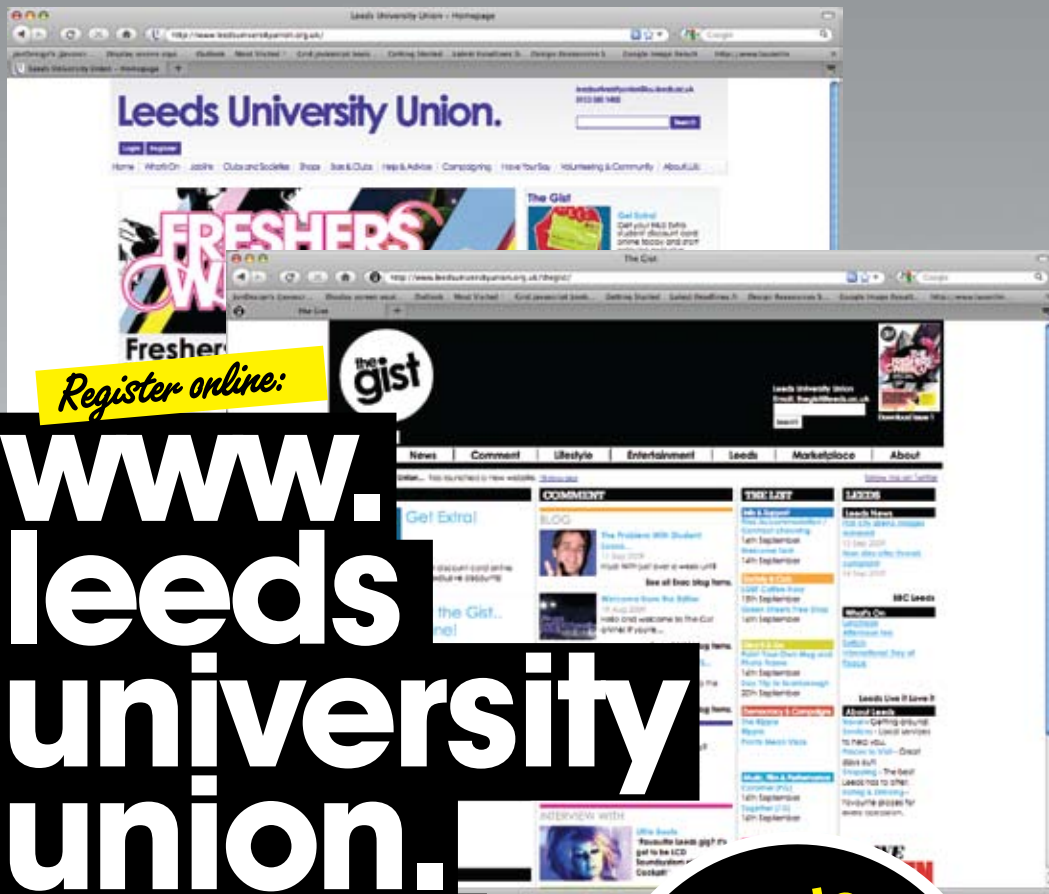

BLACK HISTORY MONTH⁰⁹

What does it mean to be black? African is the answer assumed by many, but black people have a history with roots all around the world.

'Black History Month' takes place every year in October and provides an opportunity for individuals to join together and celebrate the achievements of the Black community. It promotes important dialogue about current and past forms of oppression found in the UK and across the world. After a massive success in 2008, Leeds University Union and Leeds University's Equality Services are teaming up again with a programme that will not disappoint. We promise that whatever background you are from, there will be something for you!

This year we are asking what 'Black' means to you; does it encompass all who identify as ethnic minorities or is it reserved for those from African-Caribbean descent? Follow the debate throughout the month.

Brazil, the country with the second highest black population after Africa, is home to almost 13 million people who identify themselves as black.

People with dark skin colours have a vibrant heritage that leaves few parts of the world untouched, and while the slave trade was responsible for moving many black people around the world, to focus only on this eclipses a much broader picture. Black History Month is about recognising the contribution to society made by black people.

This is a history that has, in many cases, been under represented both in the history books and in the classroom.

Events during the day are free for spectators, and tickets are available for the closing event at Headingley Carnegie Stadium. Gates open at 6.00pm and there'll be performances by Leeds University Union's very own

Celtic Cheerleaders and the Leeds Met Dance Troupe to kick things off, followed by the rugby game itself. Presentations will be made during half time for all 50 winning teams, with the overall winners of Varsity 2009 announced at full time.

Advance tickets are only £7 from Leeds University Union Helpdesk or the Leeds Met AU office, and give you access to the stadium and the official Varsity afterparty. Tickets on the gate are £5 for the rugby game only.

With all the Leeds Uni teams hungry for victory, this year's Varsity is an unmissable event!

Interview with... Chris Hammill

Chris Hammill
Captain Mens' Rugby Team, Leeds University.

How's team morale ahead of the game?

Things are looking good, we've got a similar side to last year, we've lost only one or two players from last year's team, so we're a strong unit. Spirits are high!

How does Varsity stack up against other events in the sporting calendar?

A lot of people play it down, assuming games in the BUCS (British Universities & Colleges Sport) league must be a bigger deal. I can tell you without doubt that Varsity is the biggest game of the year. The atmosphere, the passion, the hope of victory; it's the genuine highlight of many players' careers.

What's it like running onto the pitch at Headingley Stadium?

Attendance at league games can be quite poor,

especially in the depths of a Leeds winter, so to run on in front of a 5000 strong crowd is amazing. It's a nerve-wracking experience though, and the noise can be deafening! During the game you tend to block out anything not happening in the game, you've got to stay focused.

Why should students come to the game? Aside from getting to see some good quality rugby?

To get one up over the Met! Many students will know there have been times where they wiped the floor with us, but this year the Leeds Uni side is the stronger of the two. The Rugby game is the final event at Varsity, and you get to see the presentation ceremony for all the events earlier in the day, which hopefully will be a moment to be proud.

Dear Maddie,

I was looking forward to my time at university so much that I'm starting to think I didn't think carefully enough about my choice of course. It's really different to A-level and I'm not sure if it's for me! What can I do? Quitting and packing my bags isn't what I want to do, but three years on a course I don't enjoy really doesn't sound too good either.

Answer: If you're feeling uncertain about your course, it's important to speak to your personal tutor as soon as possible. You can also speak to the student support officer, or the Student Advice Centre here in the Union. You'll need to think carefully about any decisions you make, but you should have options available as long as you act promptly.

Dear Maddie,

I keep seeing adverts warning me about sexually transmitted infections, and I'm starting to worry about my behaviour during Freshers' Week. I'm new to Leeds and don't know where I can go to get checked. Help!

Sent by email

Answer: Sexually transmitted infections are a very real consequence of unsafe sex and it's great that you're thinking about getting checked out. Looking after your sexual health is a must and I would strongly encourage you to always practice safe sex. There are free condoms available upstairs in the Student Advice Centre and in the Exec office so no excuses! It's really easy to get checked out in Leeds and despite the urban myths, it's quick and painless. The Leeds Sexual Health website (<http://www.leedssexualhealth.com>) will give you loads of info including where your nearest sexual health clinic is, and remember that the Union runs regular Chlamydia testing sessions.

Dear Maddie,

I don't know if I'm suited to student life. Everyone around me seems to be enjoying their Freshers' Week but I don't feel like I've made any real friends. Should I just carry on and hope for the best? I'm worried I'll just end up even more unhappy.

Answer: Moving to university, especially away from home, can be a daunting time. It's really important to make sure you talk to someone about how you're feeling. Try talking things through with a friend or your parents. Unfortunately, it's inevitable that not everyone gets off to the perfect start to university life, but there's a really good chance things will improve as you settle in. We're at one of the most diverse universities in the country, and one of the best things to do is meet as many new people as you can. Everyone's in the same situation at the start of term, you're not the only one looking to make friends!

One of the easiest ways to meet new and often like-minded people is through clubs and societies - a Give It A Go session is a great place to try new things, and meet new people! If you ever need someone to talk to, the Student Counselling Centre here on campus can help. They offer a drop in service at 1pm every weekday during term time, so you never need to feel like you're dealing with a problem all on your own.
