## A Year in Review:

This year was a great year for Leeds University Union with so much packed into nine months.

Here are some of the highlights!



### September

Months of planning go into the BEST **Freshers' Week** in the country – and 2009 was no exception.

The largest ever **'Give it a Go'** programme was launched with 93 groups participating!

Over 100,000 entrances were made into the Union building during the week, with the **Freshers' Fair** initiating the sale of over 8,000 club and society memberships, and a whole week that offered something for everybody to get into the swing of life in Leeds.



### October

With the arrival of October came lectures which meant a start to studying; however, with big events like **Varsity** some light - if highly competitive - relief wasn't too far away.

**30,000 Ways** was here to start action and collaboration on the huge range of issues that affect you, with talks, debates, training and stand-up comedy.

**Black History Month** asked what it means to be black, offering live performances, debates and film showings to explore the issue.



### November & December

There was the first ever **Interfaith Week**, and **Freshers Fair 2** saw hundreds more students sign up to clubs and societies.

**The Old Bar FestivALE** served up 18 ales and 5 ciders for the real ale aficionados out there, while **Community Week** focused on student living in the local community.

**Christmas Day** at LUU saw a day of snow, lots of market stalls, the Salvation Army band, Santa and his reindeer!



### January & February

One of the busiest months in our year!

**Green Week 2010** saw the last bottle of water sold in Essentials, **RAG Week** got hundreds of you involved in raising thousands of pounds for good causes, and **LGBT History Month** challenged stereotypes.

**International Cultural Festival** was a massive success, bringing a showcase of film, food and dance from around the world into the heart of the Union.



### March & April

After a week of hard campaigning, the new **Student Executive** were elected - well done to Rachel, Tim, Jack, Elliot, Marcus and Paul!

The **Christie Cup** pitted Leeds' sporting finest against Liverpool and Manchester, and the first ever **Refugee Action Week** took place. **LUU Dance Show** took place with a record 450 dancers participating. April will also see the **2nd Referendum** and of course, **Celebrate Week!**
